MEDAL ELIGIBILITY

The Frontline Britain '94 medal is only available to those who served in the areas indicated on the map below during the 1939-45 war and within the conditions stated:

ARMY

Regular Army, WAAC, Supplementary Reserve, Territorial Army, National Defence Companies, ATS, Officers Reserve, Home Guard and Allied personnel.

Eligibility of twenty-one days continuous service in the East Kent District.

Personnel who took part in Commando raids from bases in the area may apply.

NAVY

Mercantile Marine, HM Coast Guard and Auxiliary, Royal Navy, Royal Marines, WRNS, Royal Fleet Reserve, RNVR and Allied personnel.

As above or at least one operational voyage through The Straights of Dover.

AIR FORCE

RAF, WAAF, RAFVR, AAF, RAF Reserve, Balloon Squadrons, Civil Air Guard and Allied personnel.

Ground crew, twenty-one days continuous service as above.

Flying crew and Air Transport Auxiliary personnel, at least operational flight through the area.

Personnel from West Malling, Detling and Biggin Hill may also apply under these conditions.

CIVILIAN

ARP (all departments), Police – Regular, Reserve and Specials, Observer Corps, Fire Service and Auxiliary, Fire Guard, Nursing, Auxiliary Hospital Service, Midwives, St. John Ambulance Brigade, Red Cross, WVS, Salvation Army, Woman's Land Army, NAAFI, Special Register, Medical Practitioners, Post Office personnel and other essential services.

Continuous service of twenty-one days or more.

ALSO ELIGIBLE

Personnel evacuated from Dunkirk and landed at East Kent ports or who took part in the defence of Calais and Boulogne during 1940.

Personnel who served with the Canadian Army during the capture of the German Channel Guns, 1944.

Personnel who served with anti aircraft units against the 'v' weapon attacks during the summer of 1944 in the adjoining districts of West Kent, North Kent, Sussex, Surrey, Essex and Suffolk.
